## Why We Commemorate

Dr. Victor Chang, Co-chairman for overall planning and administration, Southern California Committee for Commemorating the 70th Anniversary of Ending WWII

This year is the 70th anniversary of the ending of WWII. We feel very proud and fortunate to have the opportunity to join forces with the Los Angeles County Department of Military and Veterans Affairs to sponsor a series of activities in August to commemorate this historic event.

The veterans of World War II are called the greatest generation in America, because they "gave something of themselves to protect each and every one of us, to do what needed to be done -- the dirty work of war," said Sergeant Major Raymond F. Chandler III, U.S. Army top enlisted Soldier. When World War II ended, "they went back to civilian life and did great things for our nation." This generation made enormous personal sacrifice in order to restore peace throughout the world. They helped establish a post-WWII world structure which brought about a relatively peaceful world, without another World War, for the last 70 years.

For Chinese Americans, the greatest generation includes both the WWII veterans of America and those of China. In the 1930's, China as a nation was in a life and death crisis that no one at the time could in their wildest dreams imagine the health and prosperity that most ethnic Chinese throughout the world enjoy today. The fate of China was turned around when the armed forces of two countries came together under presidential authority to support the mission of defending China against Japanese forces. The service and sacrifice of the two countries allows us the freedom to live in peace with our neighbors. Today, we pay tribute to the heroes of both countries and to the families who sacrificed much.

We remember more than 400,000 American and 3,000,000 Chinese service members and over 20,000,000 civilians who perished in World War II. Our hope is that we will never again engage in another world conflict. Commemorating the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Ending of World War II is our way of paying tribute to those who lost their lives and to honor our veterans who fought for our freedom.





## Honorable Bob J. Archuleta



The Honorable Bob J. Archuleta is a Presidential Appointee serving as a member on the Board of Visitors to the United States Military Academy at West Point.

Bob is a combat veteran and paratrooper with the 82nd Airborne Division and served

for the Montebello Police Department. Since March 2007 Bob has served on the Pico Rivera City Council.

Mr. Archuleta also served 24 years as the Los Angeles County Commissioner of Military Veteran's Affairs. He is currently a member of the United States Army Advisory Board for Military Recruitment.

## William R. Sanchez



U.S. Veteran William R. Sanchez of Monterey Park, California spent four years as a prisoner of war in Japan's Camp Omori during World War II. It was there that Mr. Sanchez met Louis Zamperini, who was portrayed in the recent Academy Awardnominated film, "Unbroken" which

displayed the harsh conditions Americans and other Allies suffered. Mr. Sanchez served as a Sergeant in the U.S. Army from 1940 to 1946.

## Lynden H. LaRouche



In 1944 Lyn joined the United States Army and served in India and Burma with the medical corps. His experience on the British Rage during the upheavals in Kalkutta deepened his understanding on what British imperialism is all about.

LaRouche has demonstrated exceptional qualities as an economic forecaster, and revived the school of physical economy.

# Yi Lu (陸逸)



Sgt. Lu joined the Chinese Army in 1941, the darkest year of WWII, and fought in Burma in 1942, as a member of the First Chinese Expeditionary Force. After a difficult retreat to India, his unit was reequipped and retrained by American instructors. He participated in the major

offensive by American-trained Chinese troops in India to cover the construction of the Ledo road, and advanced from Ledo, Assam, through Myitkyina, Mogaung and successfully met with the Chinese offensive forces on the Yunnan front at Mangyou, Burma on Jan. 28, 1945.

Sgt. Lu now lives in Southern California with his children.

# <u>Lt. Gen. Guangdou Chen</u> <u>(陳光斗)</u>



On May 20, 1938, Chinese veteran Guangdou Chen, as a communications officer, was in a crew under the command of the mission leaders Captain Huansheng Hsu and Captain Yanbo Tong to fly two U.S. made Martin B-10 bombers to execute a secret mission - to drop leaflets over major cities of Japan. These leaflets were "Open

Letter to the Japanese People" to expose the war crimes committed by the Japanese Imperial Army in China. This mission was the very first air raid by the anti-fascism allied forces over Japan during WWII.

General Chen immigrated to the U.S. in 1982 and now lives with his son in southern California.




